The ideal candidate will be a native or near-native speaker of Italian, have completed the PhD or be ABD with an excellent research record, be committed to an active agenda of research and scholarship, possess evidence of first-rate publications, be a superior in-class teacher, and be a take-charge professional. Primary teaching responsibilities will involve teaching undergraduate courses. Professors in our department teach and/or coordinate juniorlevel courses. A normal teaching load consists of two half-courses per term or the equivalent. Position Requirements The Department offers the B.A. in Italian Studies and a Minor degree in Italian as well as BA, MA and special-case PhD degrees in French and Spanish. In all, approximately 3,000 students take courses in this academic unit. The Department works closely with the Language Research Centre, a research unit involved in education, linguistics and many of the modern languages, and is a focus of intensive inter-disciplinary activity.
